### **Mindfulness for Later Life - Free Online Course**

The Gatehouse Charity is running a free online mindfulness course that is fully-funded by the Norfolk Winter Resilience Fund to support people over 65 during the coronavirus epidemic. The next online course will start in the week commencing 1 February 2021, and there may be face to face courses later on.

The course has been run successfully in the NHS for several years, and is based on the mindfulness-based stress reduction course developed by John Kabat Zin, but has been adapted for this population. There has been really good feedback from participants, and the charity has found that it improves people's attention and memory, as well as reducing loneliness, low mood, stress, anxiety and chronic pain.

It has also improved memory functioning in people in the early stages of dementia, mild cognitive impairment or people suffering from carer stress.

Mindfulness for later life was last year the topic of an all Parliamentary group in Westminster, which we were invited to attend. There is a great deal of interest in mindfulness for later life, and so it is fantastic that we are able to offer it to older adults during the coronavirus crisis.

Places are free but limited and involve a weekly meeting via Zoom, with audio recordings of the practise and handouts to be downloaded.
